WHAT'S NEW

From the Old Courthouse on the west to the renewed riverfront on the east, the grounds of Gateway Arch National Park now extend in one continuous—and pedestrian friendly—urban greenspace. The Gateway Arch's sweeping new entryway is as impressive from the outside as the inside. Throughout the park, you'll find a number of changes to improve the visitor experience.

- ▶ Reimagined, interactive museum
- Lush new walking paths
- Engaging exhibits prior to boarding the tram ride
- Revitalized riverfront
- ▶ New outdoor performance venues
- ▶ New bus drop-off locations surrounding the park

IMPROVED ACCESSIBILITY

To extend the Gateway Arch experience to as many visitors as possible, we've implemented a number of changes to improve accessibility.

- Additional pathways throughout the park, including gently sloping walkways connecting the Gateway Arch to the riverfront
- Additional bus drop-off locations closer to the new Gateway Arch entrance
- 1.5 miles of new pedestrian pathways along the riverfront
- Open floor plan for easier navigation of the new visitor center and museum. Exhibits are wheelchair accessible with small-scale tactile models and audio descriptions available.

HERE, GROUPS FIND NEW PERSPECTIVE, INSIDE AND OUT.

Bringing together art, nature, history, and adventure, the Gateway Arch is an inspiration as well as a destination. Founded by the National Park Service in 1935, Gateway Arch National Park (formerly Jefferson National Expansion Memorial) stretches from the Old Courthouse to the steps overlooking the Mighty Mississippi. In between, the Gateway Arch rises high, a bold monument to the pioneering spirit. Show your guests an experience unlike any other. We'll work with you to ensure they have a truly memorable visit.



Tram Ride to the Top

Experience a monument that moves you, from above and below. Before you board, enjoy the interactive, new tour featuring 60s-inspired animation and Gateway Arch trivia. Then, be transported 630 feet to the top of America's tallest man-made monument for exhilarating views of St. Louis, the Mississippi River, and up to 30 miles beyond.

Timed tickets required. Allow 45–60 minutes to enjoy the full experience. Availability is limited.



Old Courthouse

Your guests can stand in the footsteps of American heroes at this beautifully restored federal courthouse. The site of several pivotal cases, this is where the enslaved Dred and Harriet Scott sued for their freedom and Virginia Minor fought for women's right to vote. Ranger-led group tours can be booked in advance. Visit gatewayarch.com for details.

Riverboats at the Gateway Arch

Enjoy some of the best views of the Gateway Arch and downtown St. Louis from the middle of the Mighty Mississippi. With a variety of one-hour riverfront cruises, as well as dinner, and specialty excursions to choose from, a riverboat cruise makes a unique and relaxing addition to your group's Gateway Arch experience.
